The Righteousness of God's Law Romans 7:7-12 (pg. #943 in pew Bible)

Exposition

- 7:7a Paul raises another question that either had risen or would arise in the minds of those who asked the previous questions about the Mosaic Law in 6:15 ("Are we to sin because we are not under law?") and about God's grace in 6:1 ("Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound?").
- **7:7b** After Paul answers with an emphatic "No," he declares that the Mosaic Law is not sinful but rather serves to highlight the depth of our sinful depravity.
- **7:8-11** Paul shares how he personally came to understand how sinful he really was through the Mosaic Law.
- **7:12** Paul declares that the Mosaic Law—as God's Word—is holy, righteous, and good—and it perfectly serves and fulfills God's providential and righteous purposes!

Big Idea: God's righteous Word perfectly arouses and exposes our inherited, natural sinfulness.

Implications

1.	God S Law	causes anyone to sin.
	Rather, our sin nature naturally rebels against God's	
	righteous commands and causes us to have a strong	
	desire to	against God's Law.

۷.	Sin attempts to us into thinking
	that we are fully alive and free apart from obedience
	to God's Word. However, God's Word and Law
	our spiritual deadness
	apart from God's saving grace.
3.	Sin will seize every that you
	give it to try to deceive you and lead you astray.
4.	God's Word is always
	holy, righteous, and good.
	Observations
1.	Because Jesus Christ is the holy and sinless Son of God,
	He righteously and perfectly fulfilled every righteous
	demand of the Mosaic Law.
2.	Because Jesus Christ is the holy and sinless Son of God,
	His righteousness sacrifice for our sin on the cross
	frees us from the condemnation of God's wrath on sin.
	Application
1.	Instead of devaluing the Mosaic Law, praise God for
	the good purposes that He is always achieving
	through His Word in every age.
2.	Be aware—or beware—of sin's deceitfulness.
