
Jesus Christ's Two **Ordinances** for His Church

Matthew 28:18-20





1 Corinthians 11:21-29



- The Model for Baptism (Matthew 3:13-17)
 - -Jesus Christ set the **example** for all of His disciples to follow.
 - Christians publicy identify themselves as disciples of Jesus Christ through believer's baptism.



- The Mandate for Baptism (Matthew 28:18-20; Acts 2:38-41)
 - -Jesus Christ's command to "make disciples" **precedes** the mandated action of "baptizing them" in His name.
 - -Therefore, baptism is only for believers!



- The Meaningful Message of Baptism (1 Corinthians 15:3-4)
 - -The Gospel (or "Good News):
 - > Jesus Christ really died.
 - > He was really **buried**.
 - > He really rose again from the dead.



- The Meaningful Message of Baptism (1 Corinthians 15:3-4)
 - -Jesus Christ's <u>death</u>, <u>burial</u>, <u>and</u> <u>resurrection</u> was in accordance with the Scriptures that foretold His <u>death</u>, <u>burial</u>, <u>and resurrection</u>.



- The Meaningful Message of Baptism (1 Corinthians 15:3-4)
 - -Christian baptism is **a physical and public reminder** of how Christians are
 united with Jesus Christ in His <u>death</u>,
 <u>burial</u>, and resurrection through faith in
 His Gospel.



- The Mode of Baptism
 (Matthew 3:5, 13, 16; Acts 8:35-39)
 - -Immersion (rather than sprinkling or dipping) is the literal and natural rendering of the Greek word "baptizo."
 - "in the Jordan River"; "went down into"; "...went up from"

So what's the big deal about baptism?

- Baptism follows Jesus Christ's example.
- Baptism obeys the Word of God's commands.
- Baptism is the primary step of obedience for a Christian.
- Baptism is a public pledge to live for Christ.
- Baptism is an encouragement to the Church.

THREE OBSERVATIONS

Baptism is designed by God...

- 1. ...to **impact** Christians with the *power* of Christ's Gospel.
- 2. ...to **influence** Christians towards *public*, Christ-like living.
- 3. ...to **inspire** Christians to pursue comm<u>unity</u> ("one another") discipleship.

1. Have you been **biblically** baptized as a Christian?

- 2. If you are a Christian, and you have not been biblically baptized, what is holding you back from obeying Christ's command?
 - Fear? ("It feels awkward.")
 - Confusion? ("I don't understand.")
 - Confession? ("I wasn't saved!")

3. If you have been biblically baptized, are you being <u>faithful</u> in **fulfilling** your public commitment to live for Jesus Christ as His disciple?

4. If you have been biblically baptized, how are you encouraging your brothers and sisters in Christ and ministering to them?



- The Model for Communion (Luke 22:7-22)
 - -Jesus Christ set the **example** for His Church to follow.
 - -Christians corporately identify as Jesus Christ's Church through **Communion**.



- The Mandate for Communion (1 Corinthians 11:21-29)
 - -Jesus Christ's command is only for His Church to observe often together.
 - Therefore, Communion is only for believers!



- The Meaningful Message of Communion (1 Corinthians 11:24-25)
 - -Christian communion is a physical and corporate reminder for the Christian Church of Jesus Christ's past, once-forall, physical death on the cross.



- The Meaningful Message of Communion (1 Corinthians 11:24-25)
 - Christian communion is a physical and corporate reminder of Jesus Christ's body that was cruelly torn and killed as a substitutionary atonement for sin.



- The Meaningful Message of Communion (1 Corinthians 11:24-25)
 - Christian communion is a physical and corporate reminder of Jesus Christ's blood that was shed for a substitutionary atonement for sin.



- The Meaningful Message of Communion (1 Corinthians 11:24-25)
 - -Christian communion is a physical and corporate reminder of Jesus Christ's once-and-for-all substitutionary atonement for sin.



- The Meaningful Message of Communion (1 Corinthians 11:24-25)
 - -Christian communion is a physical and corporate reminder that Jesus Christ's body is no longer on the cross and is no longer in the tomb!



- The Mode of Communion (1 Corinthians 11:24-25)
 - -The bread and cup are only symbols and physical reminders of Christ's past crucified body and shed blood.



- The Mode of Communion (1 Corinthians 11:24-25)
 - The bread and the cup <u>did not back</u>
 <u>then</u>, <u>are not now</u>, and <u>will never</u>
 <u>become</u> Jesus Christ's physical or spiritual body and blood.



- The Mode of Communion (1 Corinthians 11:24-25)
 - -Therefore, the Scriptures do <u>not</u> teach what some religions or denominations call "transubstanstiation" or "consubstantiation."



- The Mode of Communion (1 Corinthians 11:24-25)
 - The Gospel of Jesus Christ preaches that Jesus Christ's body is no longer on the cross and is no longer in the tomb— He has died and He has risen!

Purposes of Baptism & Communion

- God's glory
- Obeying Christ's commands
- Community discipleship
- Public witness for Christ





III. The Limitations of Baptism and Communion

- Saved from God's Wrath




IV. God's Invitation to All for Eternal Life John 3:16
