God's Sovereign Election in Israel's History Romans 9:6-18 (p. #945 in pew Bible)

Overview of Romans 9-11

- Romans 9-11 is primarily focused on various details of God's sovereign plan for the nation of Israel.
- Romans 9-11 highlights at least <u>four things</u> that must be believed by Christians:
 - 1. Paul's love, sorrow, and unending burden for Israel
 - 2. God's faithful love and providential plan for Israel
 - 3. God's salvation of Gentiles through Israel's unbelief
 - 4. God's unapologetic sovereignty over all things

Observation: The nation of Israel and <u>the Church of Jesus Christ</u> will always be two distinct groups and entities.

Big Idea: God's sovereign decisions are always righteous.

Principle #1: God's	never fails—His promises
always hold firm and	(9:6-7)

- Example: God's promise to Abraham concerning Ishmael and Isaac. (9:7-9; Genesis 17-18, 21)
 - Ishmael "children of the flesh"
 - Isaac "children of the promise"
 - "Through Isaac shall your offspring be named."

Principle #2: God's	of sinners is no
dependent on or swayed by any	works,
efforts, lineage, or expectations. (9:1	1)

- Example: God's word to Rebekah concerning Esau and Jacob. (9:10-13; *Genesis 25:19-26; Malachi 1:2-3*)
 - Esau oldest vet "hated"
 - Jacob youngest yet "loved"
 - "The older will serve the younger."

Principle #3: God's sovereign	to show or withhold
is just and	(9:14, 16, 18)

- Example: God's sovereign choice in hardening Pharaoh and showing mercy and compassion to Moses. (9:15, 17; Exodus 9:10-17)
 - Pharaoh given earthy power but hardened against God's Word (to reveal God's power and glory)
 - Moses expelled from Egypt but shown mercy (to reveal the "riches of God's glory"—vs. 23)
 - "I will have mercy on whom I will have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I will have compassion."

APPLICATION

Instead of doubting and denying God's Word, or calling His choices unjust, or refusing to accept and embrace His holy and unapologetic sovereignty over all things...

- Trust in His eternal promises by faith,
- Rest in His providential sovereignty by faith, and
- Obey His holy Word by faith. (9:30-33; 1:16-17)
