## Who is Jesus? – "The King of Israel" John 12:12-50; 18:1-19:42 (p. #897 in pew Bible)

A key word or theme throughout <u>The Gospel of John</u> is "believe."

Your Notes from Reading the Text

## **Observations from the Text**

- Nothing can or will ever thwart God's sovereign will and plan.
   The sinless, sacrificial, and substitutionary death of Jesus
   Christ for our sin is the ultimate example of this truth.
- The raw injustice of Jesus Christ's court proceedings before the Jewish Sanhedrin, King Herod (Luke 23:7-11) and Pontus Pilate highlighted His innocence as the Lamb of God (1:29).
- Jesus Christ willingly, obediently, humbly, and fully fulfilled the earthly ministry that God the Father sent Him to accomplish.

- Jesus Christ fulfilled every Old Testament prophecy concerning His ministry as the promised King of Israel and the promised Savior of the world.
- Pilate's final words and inscription for the cross (19:12-22 –
   "The King of the Jews") agreed with the cries of the crowds
   when Jesus entered Jerusalem ("The King of Israel").
- Jesus Christ physically died on the cross, of which the Scriptures (and many eyewitnesses) have testified.

## Implications from the Text

- No one forced Jesus Christ to die on the cross. He willingly died on our behalf—for our sin—for His glory! (19:10-11; Matthew 26:53)
- God showed us His amazing grace and love in the death of Jesus Christ. (3:16; 15:13; Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21)

## **Applications from the Text**

- **Consider** the severity of your sin before the righteous and holy God of Heaven.
- Rejoice in God's grace and love towards you in the death of His Son, Jesus Christ.
- Reject Satan's temptations to either ignore, or grow complacent towards, or to doubt <u>the power</u> of Jesus Christ's death for the sin of the world.
- Believe in Jesus Christ's substitutionary death for your sin and only trust in <u>His righteousness</u> to save you from sin's penalty. (Luke 23:32-43; Romans 6:23)

**Big Idea:** The King of Israel died so that you could come into His Kingdom through faith in His Gospel's power and promises.
