Who is Jesus? – "The Son of God" John 20:1-31 (p. #906 in pew Bible)

Key themes in this passage are "seeing" and "believing."

- 1. This morning, we will be **reading through all of John 20. Context:** John 19:38-42—The burial of Jesus Christ's dead body
- 2. Next, we will highlight some key **observations** and **implications** from this section of God's Word.
- 3. Finally, we will make **application** from the Bible to our lives.

Your Notes from Reading the Text		

Big Idea: Jesus Christ is eternally alive and He gives eternal life to all who believe in His Gospel by faith.

Observations from the Text

 Jesus Christ allowed his disciples to observe many physical truths of His miraculous resurrection before He physically appeared to them. (20:1-10)

- Jesus Christ did not let His disciples remain in confusion or doubt concerning His resurrection from the dead.
 - Mary Magdalene (20:11-18)
 - o The Disciples (20:19-23, 30)
 - o Thomas (20:24-29)

Implications from the Text

- Jesus Christ is the Son of God. He is God and is the second Person of the triune Godhead. His resurrection from the dead confirmed beyond the shadow of a doubt that every Word that He spoke and taught about Himself is true and accurate. (20:30-31)
- Those who believe in Jesus Christ as the Son of God who died, was buried, and was resurrected from the dead are blessed by God with eternal life with Him. (20:31; 3:14-16; 5:24; 6:40; 14:6; Revelation 21:1-7)
- Those who do not believe in Jesus Christ as the Son of God who died, was buried, and was resurrected from the dead are condemned by God to eternal punishment separated from God in the Lake of Fire. (20:31; 3:17-18, 36; 10:25-30; 14:6; Revelation 20:10-15; 21:8)

Applications from the Text

- Don't just be a believer in what you can see or physically observe about Jesus Christ—the Son of God.
- God calls us to believe in the Gospel (the death, burial, and resurrection of His Son) by faith and not by sight for eternal salvation. (Hebrews 11:1-3, 6)
