Observations and Implications

- Because our sin is so great—and because Jesus Christ is the "holy and righteous One"—only He can save us from sin's penalty.
- Everyone who do not believe in Jesus Christ for salvation bears their own guilt before "the holy and righteous One"—and they will not be able to stand in the coming day of judgment. (Psalm 1:4-6)
- Ignorance of Jesus Christ's holiness and righteousness will not be overlooked or ignored in the day of judgment.
- Jesus Christ willingly sacrificed His life as the righteous and holy "Prince of Life" so that we could be forgiven from sin's penalty and live forever with Him and for His glory.

Application from the Text

- Repent of sin by turning to Jesus Christ in faith for salvation and sanctification.
- **Remember** the holy and righteous sacrifice that Jesus Christ made in our place for our salvation.
- **Rejoice** in the freedom from sin's power that Jesus Christ gives to all who trust in Him as "the holy and righteous One!"
