Learning to Worship Jesus through the Storm Matthew 14:22-33 (Page 820 in Pew Bible)

Observations & Implications

- Because Jesus greatly loves His disciples, He purposely increases and matures their faith through divinely-appointed trials and storms.
 - If you never go through any trials and storms, you are not one of Jesus' true disciples.
 - Trials are never random or a waste of time for Christians.
- II. Because Jesus greatly loves His disciples, He is careful to give them His <u>immediate</u> comfort when they become afraid.
 - Christians can take heart and have courage during trials and storms because Jesus is never far away.
 - Christians should never doubt Jesus' love for them. He is praying for them to succeed by faith (Romans 8:26-34).

- III. Because Jesus greatly loves His disciples, He never has a "Plan B" for the tests, trials, and storms that He appointed for them to face.
 - No trial that you face takes Jesus by surprise.
 - Jesus always gives Christians what is best for their spiritual wholeness.
- IV. Worshiping Jesus through trials and storms is an ongoing <u>learning</u> experience in the Christian life.

BIG IDEA: In the middle of our greatest trials and fears, Jesus is closer than a step away!
