Honoring the Lordship of Christ When Christians Disagree

- Christians will at times <u>disagree</u> on <u>non-sinful</u> things such as food and days. (14:2, 5)
- II. Christians must not sin against one another by holding one another in contempt or refusing to welcome one another. (14:1, 3-4)

- III. Christians must respect the truth of Jesus Christ's <u>Lordship</u> in their mindset and actions towards one another. (14:6-9)
- IV. Christians must submit their <u>preferences</u> and <u>convictions</u> to the Lordship of Jesus Christ with <u>thanksgiving</u>. (14:6-9)

Observations and **Application**

- Jesus Christ always encourages, admonishes, and corrects His sheep in His perfect way and time because He is their Master, Lord, and Shepherd.
- Jesus Christ never surrenders or delegates His Lordship of His Church to the Church or to individual Christians. (14:10-12)
- Christians must watch out for one another with biblical truth, love, and grace.
- In matters of personal preference and conviction (as opposed to clear violations of Scripture), Christians must...
 - 1. ...show grace to one another,
 - 2. ...trust in Jesus Christ's perfect lordship over His Church and over individual Christians, and
 - 3. ...make sure that their personal preferences/convictions are <u>"done" for the Lord's glory</u> (14:6a) and are <u>"done" in thankfulness to God</u> (14:6b).

BIG IDEA: Christians must honor Jesus Christ's lordship by welcoming other Christians who belong to Him and who are seeking to biblically honor Him.
