**Text:** Matthew 6:5-13 (Page 811 in Pew Bible)

Title: "Church Growth Matters: The Importance of Prayer"

A biblically healthy and <u>spiritually growing</u> local church will be <u>actively obeying and learning about</u> Jesus Christ's commands, principles, and desires for His Church.

**Context—Sermon on the Mount:** Instructions on giving, praying and fasting

"When you pray..." (Plural  $\rightarrow$  6:5, 7; Singular  $\rightarrow$  6:6)

- Jesus Christ instructs His disciples to pray to their heavenly Father with hearts of <u>worship</u>. (6:9-10)
  - "Our Father in Heaven"
  - "Hallowed be Your name"
  - "Your Kingdom come"
  - "Your will be done, on Earth as it is in Heaven"
- Jesus Christ instructs His disciples to pray to their heavenly Father with <u>humble</u> hearts. (6:11)
  - "Give us this day our daily bread"
    - Prayer is the Christian's "Declaration of Dependence" upon God.
  - Matthew 6:1-8

- **3.** Jesus Christ instructs His disciples to pray to their heavenly Father with <u>honest</u> hearts. **(6:12-13)** 
  - "And forgive us our debts"
  - "As we also have forgiven our debtors"
    - Matthew 6:14-15
  - "And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil (or from the Evil One)"

**Big Idea:** Church growth involves Christians growing together through biblical and unhypocritical prayer to God.

- Is your prayer life hypocritical or unhypocritical before God and others?
  - When you pray to God, is your heart worshipful?
  - o When you pray to God, is your heart humble?
  - When you pray to God, is your heart honest?

- In what ways do you need to grow and mature in this important ministry of prayer?
